Discussion (action items in bold/underline)

1. Country Data Collection Project

Kenya: Padmaja Kankipati contacted Norah Keitany, who provided a budget for the project. **Nancy Augustine** to confirm the figures and request a project timeline.

Romania: ISWP is working to establish a contract between the university and Motivation Romania.

2. Minimum Uniform Data Set (MUD):

The ISWP team incorporated feedback from the November 17 Data Collection Subcommittee call and presented new versions of minimum data set questionnaires. The questionnaires, which incorporate fields from WHO WSTP-Basic 8 Steps forms and checklists, could be used during a client's initial visit and follow-up.

Subcommittee members explained that the steps might not happen in sequence; service providers have their own forms and checklists; and it still is a lot of data to collect.

Subcommittee members acknowledged it is important that research scientists provide input on the data set, too, as some data would be collected for research purposes.

Nancy Augustine and **Krithika Kandavel** to request input from Jon Pearlman and Tricia Karg.

Eric Wunderlich offered to send questionnaires LDS Charities uses with service providers.
