Discussion (action items in bold/underline)

1. **Country Data Collection**

Motivation Romania was selected to be the in-country partner for data collection on the first pilot country — Romania. They will provide a progress report in September, with the project to be completed in December. Based on the September progress report, the subcommittee can begin work on the second pilot country — Kenya. ISWP staff did an internet search of information available in Romania with limited success, mostly data from UNCRPD and World Bank.

Action: Nancy Augustine to request Motivation Romania staff's availability for a call with Padmaja Kankipati and ISWP the week of July 25 for a project update.



2. Minimum Uniform Data Set

Karen Rispin, LeTourneau University, tested the minimum uniform data survey during a May trip to Kenya and provided feedback during the June 12 Comparative Effectiveness Research Subcommittee meeting in Dublin. Rich Schein and Karen have scheduled a follow-up call to refine the survey further.

Action: Rich Schein to provide an update on the status of the revised document, next steps and timeline.

3. Data Repository

Krithika Kandavel is preparing the submission to the University of Pittsburgh Institutional Review Board (IRB) outlining the data repository, which will include the country data and outcome measures.

Action: Krithika will keep the subcommittee informed of next steps and timeline.
